
Deacon: Bless, Master!

Priest: Blessed is the Kingdom of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, now and ever and unto ages of ages.



The Great Litany

Deacon: In peace, let us pray to the Lord.

People:  Lord, have mer - cy.

Deacon: For the peace from above and for the salvation of our souls, let us pray to the Lord.

Alternate the litany patterns between petitions.

Deacon: For the peace of the whole world, for the welfare of the holy churches of God and for the union of all, let us pray to the Lord.

Deacon: For this holy house and for those who enter with faith, reverence, and the fear of God, let us pray to Lord.

Deacon: For His Beatitude, our Metropolitan _____, for His Eminence our Archbishop _____, for His Grace, our Bishop _____, for the honourable Priesthood, the Diaconate in Christ, for all the clergy, monastics, and the people, let us pray to the Lord.
