Deacon: Bless, Master.

Priest: Blessed is our God, always, now and ever and unto ages of ages!

Deacon/Reader: Through the prayers of our holy fathers, Lord Jesus Christ our God,

have mercy on us and save us.

People: Amen.

Reader: Come, let us worship God our King. Come, let us worship and fall down before Christ, our King and our God! Come let us worship and fall down before Christ Himself, our King and our God!

The Great Litany (non-Lenten melody)1

"Blessed is the Man" is NOT sung.

The "Lord, I Call" verse is sung in the Tone of the Week followed by:

¹When no priest or deacon is present, instead of the Great Litany, the following is said by the reader:

(*Tone 8*): Turn not away Your face from Your child for I am afflicted. Hear me speedily. Draw near unto my soul and deliver it!

Priest (reader, in the absence of a priest):

- vs. Your salvation, O God, has upheld me.
- vs. Let the poor see and be glad.
- vs. Seek God, and your soul shall live.

Reader: Vouchsafe, O Lord, to keep us this night without sin. Blessed are You, O Lord, the God of our fathers and praised and glorified is Your name forever! Amen. Let Your mercy be upon us, O Lord, even as we have set our hope on You. Blessed are You, O Lord, teach me Your statutes! Blessed are You, O Master, make me to understand Your commandments! Blessed are You, O Holy One, enlighten me with Your precepts! Your mercy, O Lord, endures forever: O despise not the works of Your hands. Reader: Amen. O Heavenly King, establish the Orthodox Christians, confirm the Faith, quiet the heathen, give peace to the world, place our departed fathers and brethren in the tabernacles of the Righteous, and accept us sorrowers and penitents, for You are good and the Lover of mankind.

Prayer of St Ephrem (if Lent)

All: O Lord and Master of my life, take from me the spirit of sloth, despair, lust of power, and idle talk. (*prostration*)

But give rather the spirit of chastity, humility, patience, and love to Your servant. (*prostration*)

Yes, O Lord and King! Grant me to see my own transgressions and not to judge my brother, for blessed are You unto ages of ages. (prostration; 12 metaneias saying:" O God, cleanse me a sinner.")

Then the entire prayer is said, and a single prostration is made at the end.
