

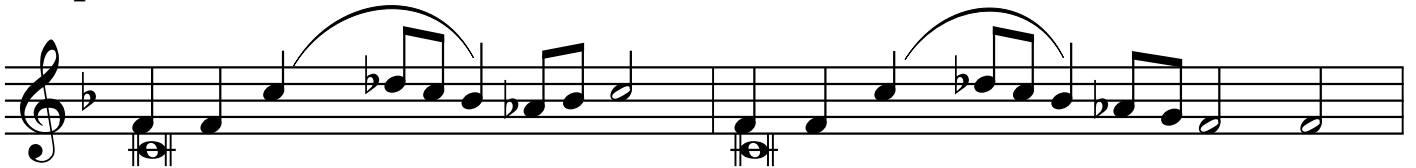
Let My Prayer Arise
