Reader:

How magnified have been Your works, O LORD: in wisdom You have made them all. The earth has been filled with Your creation. Here is the sea, great and broad; in it are reptiles beyond number, living things both small and great.

There the ships move about; and that leviathan which You formed to sport in it. All expect You to give them food in due season. When You give it to them, they gather it; when You open Your hand, all things are filled with loving-kindness.

But when You turn away Your face, they shall be stirred up. You have taken away their spirit, they shall fade away and return to their dirt. You shall send forth Your spirit, and they shall be established; and You will renew the face of the earth.

Let the glory of the LORD be forever; the LORD will be glad in His works - He Qho looks upon the earth, and makes it tremble; He Who touches the mountains, and they smoke.

# Lord, I Call

With men that work iniquity; and I will not join with their chosen. The righteous man will chasten me with mercy and reprove me; as for the oil of the sinner, let it not anoint my head. For yet more is my prayer in the presence of their pleasures; their judges have been swallowed up near by the rock. They shall hear my words, for they are sweet; as a clod of earth is broken upon the earth, so have their bones been scattered nigh unto Hades. For unto You, O Lord, O Lord, are my eyes, in You have I hoped; take not my soul away. Keep me from the snare which they have laid for me, and from the stumbling-blocks of them that work iniquity. The sinners shall fall into their own net; while I alone escape.

(*Ps. 141*) With my voice I have cried unto the Lord, with my voice I have made my supplication unto the Lord. I will pour out before Him my supplication, my affliction before Him will I declare. When my spirit was fainting within me, then You knew my paths. In this way wherein I have walked they laid a snare for me. I looked upon my right hand, and beheld, and there was none that knew me. Flight has failed me, and there is none that watches out for my soul. I have cried unto You, O Lord; I said: You are my hope, my portion in the land of the living. Attend unto my supplication, for I am brought very low. Deliver me from them that persecute me, for they are stronger than I.

Bring my soul out of prison that I may confess Your name.

The righteous shall wait patiently for me until You shall reward me.

Out of the depths I have cried unto You, O Lord; O Lord, hear my voice.

Let Your ears be attentive to the voice of my supplication.

Let us hymn and fall <u>down</u> before Christ, <u>Glo</u>rifying His resur<u>rec</u>tion from the dead, /// For He is our God, Who has delivered the world from the <u>enemy's</u> deceit.

**Reader**: My soul has waited patiently for Your word, my soul has hoped in the Lord. From the morning watch until night, from the morning watch let Israel hope in the Lord.

People: We have been <u>freed</u> from <u>suffering</u> By Your <u>suffering</u>, O Christ, <u>We</u> have been delivered from corr<u>up</u>tion By Your <u>re</u>sur<u>rec</u>tion, /// O Lord, <u>glo</u>ry to You!

**Reader**: In the 8<sup>th</sup> tone: For with the Lord there is mercy, and with Him is plenteous redemption; and He shall redeem Israel out of all his iniquities.

## People: Tone 8

People: To<u>day</u> Hades cries out <u>groaning</u>: "My dominion has been <u>sha</u>ttered. I received a <u>dead</u> man as <u>one</u> of the dead, But against Him I could <u>not</u> prevail. From eternity I had <u>ruled</u> the dead, But be<u>hold</u>, He <u>rais</u>es all. Because of Him do I <u>pe</u>rish." /// Glory to Your cross and resur<u>rec</u>tion, O Lord.

**Reader:** For He has made His mercy to prevail over us, and the truth of the Lord abides forever.

**People**: To<u>day</u> Hades cries out <u>groa</u>ning:

My power has been <u>trampled upon</u>.
The Shepherd is <u>cru</u>cified and <u>A</u>dam is raised.
I have been deprived of <u>those</u> whom I ruled.
Those whom I swallowed in my strength I have <u>given up</u>.
He Who was <u>cru</u>cified has <u>emp</u>tied the tombs.
The power of death has been <u>van</u>quished. ///
Glory to Your cross and resur<u>rection</u>, O Lord.

**Reader**: In the 6<sup>th</sup> tone: Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit...

People: Tone 6 The great Moses mystically foreshadowed this <u>day</u>, when he said: "God blessed the <u>se</u>venth day." This is the blessed <u>Sa</u>bbath. This is the <u>day</u> of rest, On which the only-begotten Son of God rested from <u>all</u> His works. He kept the Sabbath <u>in</u> the flesh, Through the dispen<u>sa</u>tion of death. But on this day, He re<u>turned</u> again Through the resur<u>rec</u>tion. He has granted us e<u>ter</u>nal life, /// For He alone is good, and the lover of man.

**Reader**: In the 1<sup>st</sup> tone: ...now and ever and unto ages of ages. Amen.
